

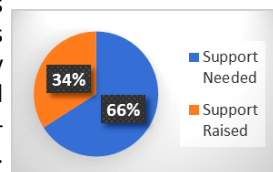

As we enter the last month of this crazy year, I look back and see how God has been with me through all of the uncertainties. I have meditated on Mark 9:23-24 many times this year. It says, "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth. And straightway the father of the child cried out, and said with tears, Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief." I believe that the Lord will use me to give hope to the hopeless. I pray the Lord will help my unbelief.

November was a very profitable month with several great meetings in Florida. I had meetings in Pace, Starke, Jacksonville, and Titusville. Unfortunately, my meeting in Titusville was canceled due to COVID. I know I have said this in every prayer letter, but I am thankful for all the churches that have given me the privilege to come and present my ministry to them this year. My January 2021 schedule is all full except for one Sunday. The Lord has shown me repeatedly that He will make a way for me to return to the Philippines. Right after I had printed my last prayer letter, Faith Baptist Church in Pikeville, Tennessee called and informed me that they are partnering with me financially. My support is now at 34%. I believe that the Lord is going to provide the support I need in His perfect timing, but I pray the Lord will help my unbelief.



While in Jacksonville, Florida I had a couple of free days between meetings. I asked one of my fellow missionary friends if there were any Filipino restaurants in the area. He told me of several, but the one that shocked me the most was Jollibee. I was shocked because Jollibee is a Filipino chain restaurant. I ate there several times while in the Philippines. I looked it up to see how close it was. It was only two miles away from where I was staying. As soon as I saw the Jollibee sign, I cried; it truly was a big hug from the Lord. I have been missing the Philippines more and more, and He knew I needed a little piece of it, to help my unbelief.



The Philippines endured another typhoon early November. It created a lot of damage on the east coast of the Island of Luzon. Heavenly Bible Baptist Church has several sister ministries; two of them are in Nacar, Quezon. I had the privilege to go and see these ministries on my survey trip. The couple that hosted us over night posted several pictures of their property with major flooding. All I could think of was the indigenous people we met. They have several camps all over. One of the camps we visited was on a riverbed. My friend Ruby, who lives there in Nacar, told me that they evacuated up into the mountains before the storm hit. I was so glad to hear everyone was safe. Please pray for all the people that were affected by the typhoon as they continue to cleanup and rebuild. Lord help their unbelief.



I know I sound like a broken record in all my prayer letters, but I am so thankful for all my supporters. I could not do what the Lord has called me to do without your prayers and financial support. Even though this year has been full of uncertainties, God has allowed me to travel full-time through your faithful giving and prayers. My goal is to return to the Philippines Spring of 2021. I believe the Lord can make this goal a reality through the right churches and individuals. I pray the Lord will help my unbelief.
